Primary Election - August 7, 2012

The Whitewater Township Primary election will take place on Tuesday August 7th. The polls are open from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm.

Political signs have been popping up all over the Township. Although our zoning ordinance calls for signs to be erected no more than 30 days prior to an election, the rule was challenged - we cannot enforce the rule as it is written. The goal of the Ordinance was to keep the area from being cluttered with signs for a long time, as they tend to blow down and come apart over time. We are hopeful that candidates will take care of their signs so this does not happen.



ANY signs that are placed in the road right of way along M-72 can and often are removed by MDOT. GTC Road Commission also picks up signs their road right-of-way. Signs that are removed can be picked up at the Road Commission.

PLEASE NOTE: Tampering with or destroying a political sign not only interferes with private property, it also shows a lack of courtesy and respect for others views. Let's everyone be civil during this time of political competitiveness, it is the best example to set.

Treasurer's Corner—Ardella M. Benak Reminder - Application for Summer Tax Deferments still available !

Applications for deferment are available at whitwatertownship.org or the Township Hall and must be returned by September 14th **annually**. Summer taxes can be deferred without interest until February 14th one of two ways;

- 1) Any tax payer whose household income does not exceed \$40,000 **and** qualify under one these classifications: 62 years or older, paraplegic/quadruplegic, blind, totally and permanently disabled, eligible veteran/service person or surviving spouse of eligible veteran/service person.
- 2) Own property, which is classified or used as agricultural real property and that the gross receipts of agricultural or horticultural operations in the previous year (or the average gross receipts for such operations in the previous three years) are not less then the household income for the preceding calendar year or the combined household incomes in the previous year of the individual members of a limited liability company that owns the agricultural real property.

Once you have received a summer tax deferment form, I will add you to a permanent listing to receive a form each year for your conveyance.

This service is provided at no cost, (up to 150lbs, \$1.30 lb. thereafter) Electronics are charged .38 cents per pound. Accepted material includes oil based paints, (latex is not accepted), cleaning products, pesticides, mercury, moth balls, pool chemicals and more

In 2011, over 50,000 pounds of household hazardous waste was collected for proper disposal.

Loon Update

The Elk River Chain of Lakes (ERCOL) Watershed may be home to the largest population of nesting loons in the Lower Peninsula of Michigan.

In 2011, 16 loon pairs returned to the Watershed. 2011 was also a tough year for the loon chicks. Only 6 of 12 reached maturity. Careless boaters, rogue loons, predation or something else may have contributed to this mortality.

Adult loons, which can live 25-30 years, begin to leave the Elk River Chain of Lakes Watershed in September. The chicks are not yet ready for migration and may continue to feed and grow in their North country homes until October. Michigan loons spend the winter in the Gulf of Mexico or along the Atlantic coast. The adults return in the spring, but the chicks remain for three to four years, until they reach maturity. Then they migrate north. The male juveniles return to the same lakes where they were raised, and the female juveniles disperse to new territories. Juveniles remain on lakes until they are seven or eight years old before they begin breeding.
