This time of year there is so much going on in our area: beautiful fall color changes, cool crisp air, apple harvest, corn mazes, football, hunting, chance of snow and the

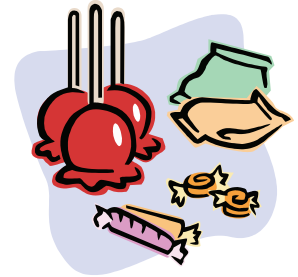

- Hot dogs, cider, chips and treats



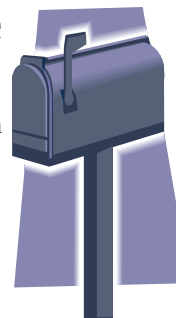

Shake Your Mailbox!

Saturday, October 15 was officially the 3rd Annual "Shake Your Mailbox Day" in Michigan. Since there was little fanfare, you may have missed it!

This statewide campaign is supported by the United States Postal Services and the County Road Association of Michigan. The campaign's purpose is to remind homeowners to prepare their mailboxes for winter. The effort came from one county frustrated by residents' complaints of damaged mailboxes associated with snow removal. Mary Gillis, GTCRC Manager states "In most instances where mailboxes are damaged the snow plow doesn't actually hit the mailbox. The force of snow thrown from the roadway is enough to knock down a loose mailbox. Damage to these posts and receptacles can often be prevented by proper routine maintenance."
